It's truly a matter of immense pleasure and great honour to present the annual report of our prestigious institution JNANADEEPA SENIOR SECONDARY SCHOOL, JAVALLI, SHIVAMOGGA, situated amidst extremely exhilarating and refreshing surroundings with a total strength of nearly 2053 students from I to XII class. This year our school saw its opening in the virtual mode. Although, the academic year 2021-22 was unexpectedly a testing year for everyone, due to worldwide pandemic COVID-19, it introduced uncertainty into the major aspects of national as well global platforms especially for schools. Yet, our school kept striving to achieve its desired goals. Technology played a significant role to help in the Teaching-learning process during school closures.

This is a hard fact that EXCELLENCE IN ACADEMICS is the hallmark of a good institution. In that case, our institution is heading towards the higher levels of accomplishments in a commendable manner. Besides excellence in academics, co-curricular activities have an important role to play in the holistic development of students. Eventually, multiple kinds of virtual activities were organised throughout the year especially during the lockdown situation to help the youngsters to engross themselves in various activities and showcase their hidden talents. Students, staying home from school, didn't completely disrupt the learning process.

Change is inevitable and progress is impossible without change. Our team of teachers rounded up some of the best educational online activities to keep students of all ages engaged in learning while they were away from the classroom. Teachers had to quickly adapt to the transfer of lesson content planned for physical classes to an online or a remote format. Activity based curriculum was adopted by our vibrant teachers to make learning, fun. Doing this successfully requires a different set of skills, and so teachers had to brush up their technological skills and learn virtual tools. Teachers responded positively to our inputs on digital skills and learning virtual tools. They proactively asked for help and practiced strategies for making learning-teaching accessible to their students. Whether it was learning to join a link for an online meeting, taking online classes, recording videos and audios, or using google forms, teachers took ownership of their own learning.

The offline classes resumed for classes 1 to 12 in the month of August 2021, since the closure due to the pandemic.

Jnanadeepa has always provided its students with a healthy, competitive and enriching environment to help them grow holistically, be it academics, sports or any other extra-curricular role. It is our prime duty to provide them with ample opportunities so that they realise their true potential and get ready to face the world.

#### Scholastic Achievements:

"Success is the result of hard work and perseverance and will to win". Achieving academic excellence is the heart of our endeavor as educators. It reflects one's ability to develop one's intellectual capabilities and skills with great diligence. The performance of the students in academics and their achievements, left all of us charged with great enthusiasm and spirit. We are happy to share the details of the best performances of our students.

The 18th batch of Class X, with 129 students produced excellent results in AISSE examination with 100% pass percentage. The 8th batch of Class XII, Science stream with 44 students excelled in the All-India Senior Secondary School Examination conducted by CBSE, and achieved 95.45% results, with 17 students scoring above 90%, 17 students above 80%, 8 students above 70%, 1 student above 60% and 1 student has scored above 50%.

The 4th batch with 32 students of Class XII, Commerce stream produced very good results in the All-India Secondary School Examination conducted by CBSE, with 93.75% pass percentage. 8 students scored above 90, 6 students above 80 and 10 students scored above 70.

The Academic year 2021-22 saw its beginning in the virtual mode on May 3<sup>rd</sup> when the classes 9<sup>th</sup> to 12<sup>th</sup> started. Later, when the pandemic situation subsided, we had the permission to start the physical classes for students in the school premises. On 26<sup>th</sup>, 27<sup>th</sup> and 30<sup>th</sup> August classes XII, XI, X and IX commenced respectively. Classes 8, 7 and 6 reopened on 6<sup>th</sup> September and 13<sup>th</sup> September respectively.

The DYSP, Lokayuktha, Mr. Mruthyunjaya, along with the BEO, Shimoga, visited the school to see the arrangements made in our school were conducive for the students' learning. They were well impressed by the arrangements made by the school and also about the SOP being followed with the true spirit.

# 4. Young Scientist Award- 2021-22

Arnay Karun of class 9 has won the young scientist award at the District Level with a cash award of ₹5000/- and has been qualified for the state level competition organised by Karnataka Vygjnana Parishath.

# 5. Veer Gatha Project:

The contest was conducted at All-India level for standard 3 to 12 students in all the States and Union Territories, as well as in all the schools affiliated to CBSE. The Union Ministry of Defence, in partnership with the Ministry of Education conducted <u>Veer Gatha Project</u> from October 21 to November 20, 2021, to create awareness regarding the Gallantry award winners.

Amrutha S, of class 9th, is one among the 25 winners selected from the students of Central Board of Secondary Education schools in country in this competition. She was honoured with an invitation to participate as a VIP Guest at the Republic Day celebrations slated to be held in New Delhi and she also received a cash prize of Rs. 10,000 for securing the prize in the painting competition. She is one among four students from Karnataka to have received such a rare honour. She bagged the prize in 9<sup>th</sup> and 10<sup>th</sup> standard category.

# 6. Azadi Ka Amruth Mahothsav- 75 Lakh Post Card Campaign

As a part of the ongoing celebrations of 75 years of India's Independence, the Department of Posts, (DOP). Ministry of Communication, along with the Department of School Education and Literacy, Ministry of Education proposed the 75 Lakh Post Card Campaign, which was organized from 1/12/2021 to 20/12/2021. 1400 students of classes 4 to 12 participated by writing the post cards on the topic 'Unsung Heroes of Freedom Struggle' or 'My vision for India in 2047'.

Three of our students Savinay H, Siddarth Godolkar and Khaji Mohammed Jowhar took part in the Science Puzzle conducted by KSCST and won Rs.750/ each at district level and were selected to participate at the state level competition. We are indeed proud that three of the winners are from Jnanadeepa School out of the four winners from the entire district.

# National Achievement Survey (NAS)

National Achievement Survey (NAS) is a nationally representative large-scale survey of students' learning undertaken by the Ministry of Education, Government of India. NAS gives a system level reflection on effectiveness of school education. Findings help compare the performance across spectrum and across population in order to find the desirable direction for improvements. The National Council of Educational Research and Training (NCERT) has developed the Assessment Framework for gauging the competencies attained by the student's vis-a-vis learning outcomes.

National Achievement Survey-2021 was scheduled on 12th November 2021. A pre-survey meeting was held on 11th November 2021. Mr. Jangam Sunil Kumar, Asst. Secretary, CBSE Regional Office, Bangalore, Mr. Basavarajappa B. R. District Nodal Officer, DDPI and Principal, DIET and Mr. Srikanth M. Hegde, District Level Co-ordinator and Principal, Janaadeepa Senior Secondary School, Javalli were present.

240 teachers from 21 CBSE schools were appointed as NAS observers for Grade 3, 5, 8 and 10 students of State Govt. schools, Govt. Aided schools, Private Unaided recognized schools and Central Government schools. They also collected survey details from the

sample schools and handed over to the CBSE representative Mr. Jangam Sunil Kumar.

The survey was successfully conducted with the support of SSSC Principals, especially the CBSE school's city co-ordinator Mrs. Indu G.V Principal Bharatiya Vidya Bhavan, Resource Centre Co-ordinator, Mrs. Latha Robert, Principal, St. Joseph School, Bhadravathi and Mr. Lingaraju, Resource Centre Co-ordinator, Principal Channamallikarjuna School, Shikaripura.

#### Vaccination

With the help of the Primary Health Centre Doctors and the staff members from Gondichetnalli, deworming was done for the students by giving albendazole tablets on 8<sup>th</sup> December 2021.

On 7th January 2022, Covid Vaccination was administered to 559 students of the age group between 15 and 18.

On 31st March 2022, Covid vaccination was administered to 288 students of the age group between 12 and 14. The vaccination team was led by Dr. Anil Kumar, PHC, Gondichetnalli, and Dr. Kanthesh, Pediatrician accompanied him.

The DNT Vaccination was administered to 35 Students and 211 students of class 1 and class 5 respectively on 7th January 2022.
